**A. PROCLAMATION – FILL THE BOOT FOR MDA DAY**

Councilmember Orach presented a proclamation in honor of “Fill the Boot for MDA Day” and the annual fundraiser to fight Muscular Dystrophy. Firefighter, Nicholas LaMonica, accepted the proclamation.

**B. GOING THE EXTRA MILE (GEM) AWARD PRESENTATION**

City Manager Haydon presented the Going the Extra Mile Award to Recreation and Parks staff members Ryan Heath, Gabriel Velasco, Ronald Medrano, and Alfonso Morin. Armando Ruiz was not able to attend the meeting. They received the award in recognition of their role implementing more than 100 events and programs this year for the City and its partner agencies.

**C. GAYLE PRATT RESOLUTION – RECREATION & PARKS/PLANNING COMMISSION**

Councilmember Boysen recognized Gayle Pratt and her husband for their community involvement and thanked them for their contributions to the City.

**Resolution No. 2016-136 adopted.** A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SANTA MARIA, CALIFORNIA, COMMENDING GAYLE PRATT ON HER RETIREMENT AS A COMMISSIONER WITH THE RECREATION AND PARKS COMMISSION AND THE PLANNING COMMISSION.

City Manager Haydon took a moment to recognize Interim Fire Chief Kenley for his service. Prior to coming to the City of Santa Maria, Chief Kenley had been the Interim Fire Chief for the City of Davis; and before that, Fire Chief for the Cities of Brisbane and Lodi. Mr. Haydon thanked him for bringing many operational changes and best management practices to the Fire Department and for being an excellent mentor to the staff.

Chief Kenley thanked the City for the privilege of leading the department over the last year and said he was impressed with the professionalism within the City.

**2. PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD**

David Cornejo, representing Smart 72, spoke about the Property Assessed Clean Energy (PACE) program in San Luis Obispo County. PACE is a financing mechanism that enables low-cost, long-term funding for energy efficiency and is repaid as an assessment on the property owner's regular tax bill. He encouraged the Council to implement the program in the City of Santa Maria.

**C. HANCOCK TERRACE - RELEASE OF FAITHFUL PERFORMANCE BOND**

The City Council accepted as complete the public improvements associated with Hancock Terrace, Tract 5989, and authorized the release of a Faithful Performance Bond (#4390747) in the amount of \$848,969; and ordered that the Contractor, Labor, and Materials Bond in the amount of \$424,485 be retained for six months and the Guarantee & Defective Materials Bond in the amount of \$84,897 be retained for one year, from the date of the release of the Faithful Performance Bond for Public Improvements.

**D. WARRANTS**

Warrant Nos. 203351 to 203631 totaling \$338,275.06 were ordered ratified subject to having been certified as being in conformity with the budget and having been approved for payment by the Director of Finance. Warrant Nos. 197709, 198203, 202992, and 203201 were cancelled.

**REPORT BY CITY MANAGER:**

Mr. Haydon also announced that staff had begun meetings regarding upcoming winter storm preparedness.

Councilmember Boysen reported he attended the Central Coast Water Agency monthly Board Meeting, and the County Board of Supervisor's Meeting just prior to this evening's Council Meeting where the Board of Supervisor's approved the acquisition of the Table A water, but discussions were going to continue with regard to the liability to the County of Santa Barbara and the environmental process. He mentioned that several cities and water agencies were in support of the acquisition, including Montecito, Goleta, and Carpinteria.

Councilmember Orach reported he attended his 55<sup>th</sup> High School Reunion and a LAFCO meeting that included a tour of Bradbury Dam.

Councilmember Zuniga reported that she attended Allan Hancock College's Counseling Summit; the Foodbank's Empty Bowls Fundraiser; the Good Samaritan Fundraiser at Klondike's Pizza; the Pastors' Appreciation Luncheon at First Christian Church; a meeting with a group of young Rotarians; and the Inaugural Multi-Sports Use Field Committee Meeting.
