**B. CERTIFICATE OF CANVASS OF GENERAL MUNICIPAL ELECTION.**

Chief Deputy City Clerk Garietz gave a presentation as detailed in the Council Agenda Report. The City of Santa Maria consolidated its General Municipal Election held on November 8, 2016, with the Statewide General Election which was conducted by the County of Santa Barbara Elections Division. On December 6, 2016, County Clerk-Recorder Joseph Holland certified the election results. Based on the certified election results, City Clerk Patti Rodriguez and City Treasurer Teresa Hall were re-elected to four-year terms. Mayor Patino was re-elected for another four-year term. Mike Cordero and Michael Moats were elected as new members of the City Council for four-year terms.

**C. OUTGOING COUNCILMEMBER COMMENTS**

Mayor Patino presented Councilmember Zuniga with a proclamation in recognition of her service on the City Council. Councilmember Zuniga thanked the City Council and took a few moments to congratulate new Councilmembers Moats and Cordero and then she recalled memories from her four years on the Council.

Mayor Patino presented Councilmember Orach with a proclamation in recognition of his service on the City Council. Councilmember Orach thanked the City Council and took a few moments to recall highlights of his 30 years of service.

Stephen Herter, a representative for Assemblyman Jordan Cunningham, also presented a Certificate of Appreciation to Councilmember Orach.

Tom Urbanske, former 5<sup>th</sup> District Supervisor and City Councilmember, thanked Councilmember Orach for his reliability and integrity throughout his 30 years of service.

Mayor Patino and Councilmembers thanked Councilmember Orach for his years of service. City Manager Haydon recalled Councilmember Orach's efforts in establishing the City of Santa Maria as an All-America City. He also noted Councilmember Orach's involvement with the Santa Maria Valley Youth Soccer Organization, the Santa Maria Youth Basketball League, the acquisition of the Veteran's Memorial Building, the renovation of Atkinson Park, building of the Hagerman Sports Complex,

The City Council conducted the second reading and adopted Ordinance No. 2016-25 amending the Zoning Map for approximately 2.7 acres from CM (Commercial Manufacturing) to PD/R-3 (Planned Development/High Density Residential) zoning district for the Residences at Depot Street project.

**4. NOMINATION AND ELECTION OF MAYOR PRO TEM**

City Manager Haydon gave a brief presentation as detailed in the Council Agenda Report stating there were no formal rules as to how the Mayor Pro Tem was selected. The Mayor Pro Tem's responsibility is to act on behalf of the Mayor in the Mayor's absence, as needed. The selection of Mayor Pro Tem is made on an annual basis.

Mayor Patino nominated Councilmember Boysen to serve as Mayor Pro Tem for calendar year 2017.

Councilmember Boysen was appointed as Mayor Pro Tem for calendar year 2017 on motion by Mayor Patino, seconded by Councilmember Waterfield, and carried on the following vote: 5-0

**5. COUNCIL APPOINTMENTS TO OUTSIDE BOARDS, COMMISSIONS AND COMMITTEES REQUIRING COUNCIL REPRESENTATION.**

City Manager Haydon gave a presentation as detailed in the written Council Agenda Report. There are currently ten outside boards and commissions with Council representation. The Mayor makes the appointments and the Council confirms the selection. Staff has conferred with Mayor Patino regarding Councilmember assignments to the various boards, commissions, and committees. Mayor Patino requested that the following appointments be made:

On motion by Mayor Patino, seconded by Councilmember Waterfield, and carried unanimously, all appointments were confirmed.

**6. ASSIGNMENT OF BOARD/COMMISSION APPOINTEES TO INCOMING COUNCILMEMBERS.**  
The City Council considered the process of determining the assignment of commission and committee appointees to incoming Councilmembers.

Chief Deputy City Clerk Garietz gave a presentation as detailed in the Council Agenda Report. The Planning Commission, Recreation and Parks Commission, and Block Grants Advisory Committee appointments are made when each Councilmember nominates a representative to said group, the Mayor accepts the nomination, and the Council ratifies the nomination. For the last two decades, with each prior election cycle, an incumbent Councilmember and a new Councilmember would be elected whereby the incumbent Councilmember would retain his/her previous appointments, and the new Councilmember would assume an outgoing Councilmember's appointments. The 2016 election resulted in two new Councilmembers being elected; therefore, the procedure for making assignments needs to be determined. Staff recommended creating a procedure to determine which new Councilmember would take on which Committee/Commission appointee from the previous Councilmember.

Under staff's proposed procedure, each new Councilmember would chose a number between 10 and 50. The Chief Deputy City Clerk provided the Mayor with a box of pre-numbered (10 to 50) cards and ask her to draw one card. The Councilmember with the number closest to that drawn by the Mayor would inherit the appointees of the longest serving outgoing Councilmember, in this case Councilmember Orach. The other Councilmember would inherit the other appointees from the other outgoing Councilmember.

In the event of a tie, the process would be repeated using numbers 1 thru 10.

Public input

There were no requests to speak.

Council discussion

There was no Council discussion.

By consensus of the Council, the aforementioned process to assign appointees of outgoing Councilmembers to newly elected Councilmembers was approved.

Chief Deputy City Clerk Garietz conducted the lot drawing. Councilmember Moats was assigned to receive outgoing Councilmember Orach's appointments. Councilmember Cordero was assigned to receive outgoing Councilmember Zuniga's appointees.

**REPORT BY CITY MANAGER:**

City Manager Haydon presented a 2016 Year-End Review of the City's accomplishments. Operation Matador was perhaps the most notable accomplishment resulting in the arrests of more than a dozen MS-13 gang members. Another major accomplishment, thanks to the Community Development and Recreation & Parks Departments, was the establishment of the successful Downtown Friday Night Markets. The construction of the Enos Ranchos Development was started and will offer a Costco with

a fueling station, a Lowes Home Improvement store, Petco, Chick-fil-A, a Habit Burger Grill, and several other stores and restaurants.

A new Fireworks Education Campaign was implemented reducing the use of illegal fireworks and the City held a Fireworks Show for the community on the 4<sup>th</sup> of July. The Oakley Park Improvements project was successfully completed and the Recreation & Park's Safe and Strong Program extended throughout the summer so that more than 1,700 local youths could participate.

Drought-tolerant landscaping projects were established throughout the community. Smoke-free areas were designated in City parks and facilities. Construction of a denitrification bio-filter system at Jim May Park was initiated in an effort to clean the water going into the basins at the north end of the City. The Greyhound Bus terminal was relocated to the Transit Center.

Additionally, the City Utilities Department was the first to volunteer to participate in the new Adopt-A-Road program. A number of dumpsters were cleaned up and relocated in the City. A new mattress recycling program was put into place, saving space in the landfill. More than 25 public service announcements were made, about half of which involved messages regarding traffic safety.

The library established a tutor and online tools system via the free Homework Help Program. The Chamber of Commerce and City staff established the Santa Maria Tourism Improvement District (with a two percent increase in Transient Occupancy Tax) and a new marketing plan for the Santa Maria Valley.

A new Toastmasters Club, Speaker Series, and continued succession/leadership academies were established for City staff growth and educational opportunities.

City Manager Haydon closed his report saying the next regular City Council Meeting scheduled for January 3<sup>rd</sup> would be cancelled. The next meeting would be January 17, 2017, and would begin with a 4:30 p.m. Closed Session followed by Open Session at 6:30 p.m.; the Hometown Heroes Presentation; a number of no-stopping zones; appointments to the Planning Commission, the Recreation & Parks Commission, the Measure U2012 Committee, and the Block Grants Advisory Committee; and 2017 Technical Amendments to the Santa Maria Municipal Code.

Councilmember Waterfield asked when Bradley Road at Enos Ranchos would be opened.

Public Works Director Kahn responded that the target date to open was scheduled for mid-January.
