C. POLICY FOR GIFTS AND DONATIONS TO THE CITY

Resolution No. 2017-01 was adopted establishing dollar thresholds and procedures for acceptance and documentation of gifts and/or donations made to the City.

D. SOLAR ROOFTOP FOR THE SANTA MARIA VALLEY HUMANE SOCIETY

Resolution No. 2017-02 was adopted authorizing the City Manager to execute a Letter of Understanding for a rooftop solar project at the Santa Maria Valley Humane Society located on City property at 1687 Stowell Road.

E. HERITAGE AT WESTGATE RANCH - RELEASE OF FAITHFUL PERFORMANCE BONDS

The City Council accepted as complete the public improvements associated with Heritage at Westgate Ranch, Tract 5969, Phases 1 & 2, and authorized: a) the release of a Faithful Performance Bond (#4395042) in the reduced amount of \$100,000 posted in the form of a Surety for the construction and installation of public improvements; and b) ordered that the Contractor, Labor and Material Bond in the amount of \$393,985.35 be retained until July 2017 and the Guarantee & Defective Material Bond

in the amount of \$78,797.07, be retained until January 2018. Council also accepted as complete the public improvements associated with Heritage at Westgate Ranch, Tract 5969, Phases 3 & 4, and authorized: a) the release of the Faithful Performance Bond for Boundary Walls (#4401303) in the amount of \$353,390.40 posted in the form of a Surety to guarantee installation of the required Boundary Walls; and b) ordered that the Contractor, Labor and Material Bond in the amount of \$176,695.20 be retained until July 2017.

F. WARRANTS

Warrant Nos. 204703 to 205182 totaling \$3,782,570.19 were ordered ratified subject to having been certified as being in conformity with the budget and having been approved for payment by the Director of Finance. Warrant Nos. 203284 and 203738 were cancelled.

G. PAYROLL

Payment of payroll was ordered ratified subject to having been certified by the proper Department Heads, as shown on records on file in the Department of Finance and having been approved for payment by the Director of Finance.

H. GRANT APPLICATION TO THE HOUSING-RELATED PARKS GRANT PROGRAM

This includes the programs sponsored by the Commission such as Area Agency on Aging, Health Insurance Counseling & Advocacy Program, and Senior Employment. The Commission serves Santa Barbara and San Luis Obispo Counties. Members are appointed by the Mayor and confirmed by the City Council. One (1) new application was received.

Recreation and Parks Commission
