**1. PROCLAMATIONS/COMMENDATIONS/PRESENTATIONS:**

**A. PROCLAMATION – OVARIAN CANCER AWARENESS MONTH**

Councilmember Cordero presented a proclamation in honor of “Ovarian Cancer Awareness Month” September 2017. Cristina Martins-Sinco, representing the Teal Journey Ovarian Cancer Foundation, accepted the proclamation.

**B. PROCLAMATION – CHILDHOOD CANCER AWARENESS MONTH**

Councilmember Moats presented a proclamation in honor of “Childhood Cancer Awareness Month” September 2017. Jennifer Tomilloso accepted the proclamation on behalf of her daughter, Carys Tomilloso, a 13 year old 8<sup>th</sup> grader currently battling cancer.

**2. PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD**

City Attorney Trujillo clarified that the first public comment portion of the evening would be held for anyone wanting to speak on closed session items, consent agenda items, or any items not on the agenda. The second public comment period would be held for anyone unable to arrive at 5:30 p.m. to speak during the first session and for those wishing to speak on items NOT scheduled on the agenda.

Sara Macdonald asked the Councilmembers to participate as much as their schedules allow for at local events.

Ernest Armenta asked that voters have the option to vote for a two-tier retirement system and that the City Attorney be an elected position.

Connie Logeman, representing Casa of Hope, spoke about the need to increase awareness and prevention of human trafficking.

Hans Duus spoke about the Mayor's Youth Safety Task Force, and the importance of getting youth into classes and involved in their community to give them hope and a desire for a productive future.

Mayor Patino invited Mr. Duus to the next Task Force meeting on September 18<sup>th</sup>.

**A. ORDINANCES**

The reading in full of all ordinances and resolutions was waived. Ordinances on the Consent Calendar were adopted by the same vote cast at the first reading unless City Council indicated otherwise.

**B. MINUTES**

The Minutes of the regular Meeting of the City Council of August 15, 2017, were approved as submitted.

**C. FAITHFUL PERFORMANCE BOND – WINDSET FARMS**

The City Council authorized the release a Faithful Performance Bond (#105585167) in the amount of \$570,000 posted to guarantee frontage improvements at Carmen Lane, Sonya Lane, and "E" Street pursuant to a Development Agreement (Phases 1 through 4) associated with Windset Farms, in lieu of a new Faithful Performance Bond (#106545899) in the amount of \$2,377,980 pursuant to a new Development Agreement for Phase 4 which includes said public frontage improvements.

**D. WARRANTS**

Warrant Nos. 209371 to 209626 totaling \$2,065,443.29 were ordered ratified subject to having been certified as being in conformity with the budget and having been approved for payment by the Director of Finance. Warrant Nos. 207235, 208949, and 209131 were cancelled.

**E. PAYROLL**

Payment of payroll was ordered ratified subject to having been certified by the proper Department Heads, as shown on records on file in the Department of Finance and having been approved for payment by the Director of Finance.

**F. COUNTYWIDE LIBRARY AGREEMENT**

Resolution No. 2017-107 was adopted approving an agreement with the County of Santa Barbara for the operation of a Countywide Free Library System for fiscal year 2017-18.

**Resolution No. 2017-107 adopted.** A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SANTA MARIA, CALIFORNIA, APPROVING AN AGREEMENT WITH THE COUNTY OF SANTA BARBARA, THE CITY OF LOMPOC, AND THE CITY OF SANTA BARBARA TO PROVIDE FOR THE OPERATION OF A COUNTYWIDE FREE LIBRARY SYSTEM.

**G. OFFICE OF TRAFFIC SAFETY GRANT**

Resolution No. 2017-108 was adopted authorizing the appropriation of \$365,000 to be allocated to the Santa Maria Police Department under the provisions of the California Office of Traffic Safety Selective Traffic Enforcement Program, Grant PT18077, for continued enforcement efforts targeting critical traffic areas in the City.

**4. APPOINTMENT TO THE BLOCK GRANTS ADVISORY COMMITTEE.**

Chief Deputy City Clerk Garietz gave a presentation as detailed in the Council Agenda Report. The Council was asked to make one (1) appointment to the Block Grants Advisory Committee.

Block Grants Advisory Committee

With one (1) vacancy on the committee, applications were received from Cassandra Bennett, Georgina Duran-Conn, Kathy Hayes, Steve Lopez, and Sharon McConnell.

Councilmember Waterfield nominated Georgina Duran-Conn.

Mayor Patino accepted the nomination of Georgina Duran-Conn; and on motion by Councilmember Waterfield, seconded by Councilmember Cordero, Ms. Duran-Conn was appointed to the Block Grants Advisory Committee to serve a term of three (3) years each ending in July 2020, and carried unanimously: 4-0-1

**5. SANTA MARIA MUNICIPAL CODE UPDATE – CHAPTER 4-18 MESSAGE.** This item was continued to the October 17, 2017, City Council Meeting so that staff would have the opportunity to hold another workshop with massage therapists to fully vet suggested revisions to the Santa Maria Municipal Code massage ordinance.
