Mayor Patino called the meeting to order at 5:30 p.m.

1. PROCLAMATIONS/COMMENDATIONS/PRESENTATIONS

A. ADOPT-A-ROAD PRESENTATION

Park Services Manager Davis and Special Districts Supervisor Christian gave a presentation on the Adopt-A-Road program and distributed certificates in recognition of the volunteers associated with the program. Participants included JD Humann Landscaping, Boys & Girls Club, Andrew Misawic Family, Premier Auto Body-Paz Family, State Farm-Donna Randolph, City Code Compliance Division, City Utilities Department, City Hall Employees, Santa Maria Noontime Lions, Minerva Club, Association of Professionals & Students, Iglesia La Luz Del Mundo, Buena Vista Beautifiers, Democratic Club of Santa Maria, and the Lyons Family-Dottie Lyons.

Mayor Patino invited Elks Recreation representative, Bob Orach, to summarize the recent Window Decorating Contest for "Go Rodeo Days" which were designed and painted by local high school students in art classes from the area schools. 144 students participated in the window decorating contest. The top winner was Wells Fargo who decorated about fourteen of their seventeen windows. Santa Maria Chrysler Jeep Dodge was the main sponsor of the contest.

2. PUBLIC COMMENT

Laura Henderson spoke about the Public Arts Committee, and encouraged the Council to approve the Committee's proposed Art Plan ordinance.

Elvia Delgado expressed concern about H-2A housing, and suggested having farmworkers housed on the farms where they work.

Cheryl Ausan spoke about H-2A housing, and asked for help with problems pertaining to H-2A housing in her neighborhood.

City Manager Stilwell commented that the first public meeting regarding H-2A housing is scheduled for Thursday, June 14th at the Atkinson Community Center at 5:30 p.m.

Public Information Manager Van de Kamp gave a brief report on fireworks use in the City. Staff has implemented public service announcements in local movie theatres and is distributing posters, flyers, and website information. Free English/Spanish yard signs are available to those who request them from the City Manager's Office. The only time safe & sane fireworks may be used is between 11:00 a.m. on 11:00 p.m. on the 4th of July. Fireworks use any other day will be subject to a \$1,000 fine. Santa Barbara County Animal Services will have pet crates available for pet owners who have animals that are easily frightened by fireworks.
