1. Call to Order:

5. Old Business:

- a. Nordon bombsight vaults- no new developments
- b. Foster Road dragstrip- no new developments
- c. Smith house- no new developments
- d. Alvin Street house tabled for future discussion
- e. SMHS Ethyl Pope Auditorium- in discussion with representatives of the district, they are ready to proceed with a special designation, pending a letter of agreement on terms of the ordinance.
- f. McClelland Street property tabled due lack of response from current owners.
- g. First United Methodist Church- governing board is considering upgrading merit designation to Landmark status after receipt of addition information.

6. New Business

- a. Mr. David Beas and Mark Mueller, City of Santa Maria, presented artists renderings of possible sign designs for Palm Court, a Merit Property. Joey requested that the carriage image be removed from design. Material to be engineering grade aluminum and reflective, Size, color scheme and final

shape are flexible and open to committee recommendations. Mounting to be on 2" pipe, six feet tall. Timeline fairly quick. Committee discussion leaned toward light beige with brown lettering. Committee discussion included whether buggy should be universal design for all signs throughout the city.

Mr. Beas suggested mounting sign on a dedicated pole on Broadway entrance. Joey suggested signs at both Broadway and Speed St. entrances. Jim asked Steve to produce a photographic mock-up of what signs would look like in situ.

On Saturday, Oct 10th, the Santa Maria Historical Society offered a presentation on the history of the Santa Maria Cemetery at Shepard Hall, at the Santa Maria Public Library. The cemetery received landmark status from the City of Santa Maria on April 20, 1999
