THE COVER

Los Flores Ranch Park is the first of its kind regional open space park in the Santa Maria Valley. At 1,774 acres (nearly 2.8 square miles), the property lies about eight miles south of Santa Maria in the Solomon Hills. The park offers the public a rare mix of environmental education, land preservation, and recreation, with about eight miles of hiking/equestrian/mountain biking trails. Habitats range from maritime chaparral to riparian. Wildlife inhabiting the park includes, but is not limited to, numerous species of birds, wild hogs, squirrels, rabbits, bobcats, and cattle.
